BCLI is a 3-month arts-based community engagement program that:

- Supports girls development as leaders
- Instructs girls about current events, advocacy, mental health, and solutions to community needs

During the initiative, girls will:

- Participate in workshops that emphasize storytelling, personal development, and skill acquisition
- Choose an important community issue and create a "Take Action" project to educate others while creating positive change

Participating in workshops and community-focused projects for positive change is linked to higher levels of well-being, increased empathy and resilience, and greater leadership skills.

One World Girl partners with schools and community organizations in the Westchester and New York Metropolitan area to offer our Leadership Initiative each semester. We identify 20-24 of their middle and high school girls to participate in the program with full scholarships; currently, 150 girls in total will be served through BCLI each year.
